Educational Enterprises, Inc. and The Gayton Kirk Presbyterian Church are concerned about children in grades 2 through 5 who are struggling with reading, spelling and writing. The two organizations have joined together to sponsor literacy training so volunteers can help these children.

Several programs have volunteers who go into schools to read to children or provide books for children. The goal of The Reading Brigade, however, is to train volunteers in a program called *Wordstorming*. This program helps children develop literacy skills during each session, even if the volunteer does not have a teaching background.

The goal of the *Wordstorming* program is to maximize the time a tutor spends with a child.

Educational Enterprises, Inc. was formed in 1994, and its mission is to empower individuals through education.

What is Wordstorming?

Wordstorming, a user-friendly literacy program to help struggling readers and writers, will:

- * Engage oral language, known vocabulary and prior knowledge in the instruction
- * Develop decoding skills
- * Practice the application of learned sound-symbol associations and syllable patterns
- * Develop vocabulary
- * Improve spelling
- * Embed skills in text through writing
- * Practice writing paragraphs or stories
- * Increase reading fluency



Wordstorming is a user-friendly literacy program to help struggling readers and writers.

The lesson is scripted, and the process is the same for each lesson. Lessons are based on the recommendations of the National Reading Panel and are easy to do.

Each lesson includes using a word wheel to identify words having a specific sound and making cards on those words to be used to practice sounding out and spelling the words. Knowledge of the meanings of the words is checked, and the words are used to write a story that is then read by the child to develop reading fluency and confidence.

What training will volunteers need?

The program is scripted, and the process can be taught in a two-hour workshop.

How much time is required for the volunteer? After the two-hour training, each identified child would connect with the tutor for two one-hour sessions each week. This can be done by one volunteer twice a week for an hour each time, or by two volunteers, working as a team, each doing one of the two weekly one-hour sessions.

What would the process look like for my organization?

Once a contract has been signed, the training can take place at the organization's location, the Gayton Kirk or Educational Enterprises.

The training will be offered at **no cost other than a materials fee** at this time (materials are currently available through a contribution by Educational Enterprises, Inc.). In the future, the program would be available at cost.

Administrators/tutors who are identified by the sponsoring organization would attend the two-hour training session.

The program uses a "Trainer of Trainers" model, and the sponsoring organization would be fully responsible for the implementation of *Wordstorming* so each organization can customize the program to its needs. Educational Enterprises, Inc. and the Gayton Kirk will have no responsibility or liability other than providing the training.

Lessons are based on the recommendations of the National Reading Panel and are easy to do.
